Growing up in Central Florida, Raymond faced housing instability and periods of homelessness yet never lost sight of his potential. Today, Raymond is attending Duke University on a full-ride scholarship, preparing to study physics and pursue a future shaped by curiosity and leadership. 

MEET O'SHEA: WHERE BELONGING BEGINS

At just 11 years old, O'Shea has already faced more than most children should. The youngest of three brothers, he lives with a great-aunt who is confined to her bed and a great-uncle working two jobs just to keep their household together. With his parents absent and his family stretched thin, O'Shea stood at a crossroads — vulnerable to the same paths that had already pulled others he loved off course.

Then one day, everything changed. After a call from Seminole County Sheriff's Office alerted our team that a young boy needed support, O'Shea walked through the blue doors of the Club the very next morning. What he found was safety, caring adults, and peers who welcomed him without hesitation. Within moments, he was pulled into a game, his face lighting up with a grin that said it all. That smile is what safety looks like. It's what belonging feels like. And it's the foundation that will help O'Shea not only imagine a brighter future — but build it.

For Savannah, age 11, Boys & Girls Club is more than an after-school program — it's a community. In the letter below, her mother shares how the Cocoa Branch supports not only Savannah, but their entire family, showing up with compassion, consistency, and care when it's needed most.

This Club is more than just a place for children — it is a village. A village that partners with parents, steps in when we're tired, overwhelmed, or simply need support, and shows up without hesitation. On days when my mental health needed protecting, the staff stepped in with care, patience, and understanding, reminding me that I'm not alone in raising my child.

The staff are teachers in so many ways — not just academically, but in life. They teach responsibility, respect, accountability, and self-worth. They hold Savannah accountable while still honoring her as an individual, and their discipline is always rooted in love, guidance, and the best possible choices for her growth. They help protect her from learning certain lessons the hard way, guiding her gently while still allowing her to grow.

What means the most is that they give their time freely, without complaints, with genuine hearts and consistent dedication. They see our children, they know them, and they care deeply about who they are becoming.

The Boys & Girls Club has become one of the best parts of our lives. I am incredibly grateful for every staff member who pours into these children daily. Your impact is lasting, your presence is powerful, and your work does not go unnoticed.

Thank you for being a safe place, a guiding light, and a true village for our children and for us as parents.



YEAR IN REVIEW

1. WE OPENED THE DOORS TO OUR NEWEST CLUB LOCATION

Tangelo Park Branch, located at Tangelo Baptist Church, became our 39th location with support from the Universal Orlando Foundation and Commissioner Mike Scott, expanding access to opportunity for Tangelo Park youth.

2. WE COMMENCED CONSTRUCTION ON BUILDING A NEW WINTER GARDEN BRANCH

We broke ground on our future Winter Garden Branch in October 2024, officially launching construction on a new Club that will be named in honor of Randy and Jamie June — longtime champions of Boys & Girls Clubs. Thanks to dedicated partners and donors, the new Club, which will more than quadruple our capacity to serve in Winter Garden, will open in 2026.

3. WE CONSTRUCTED A BRAND-NEW PLAYGROUND

We partnered with KABOOM! and DaVita to build a brand-new playground at our Joe R. Lee Branch, expanding access to safe play for Eatonville youth with the help (and muscle!) of more than 200 volunteers.



4. WE UPGRADED OUR TEEN SPACES

We leveled up teen spaces across our Clubs, opening a brand-new Teen Center at our Marydia Branch and upgrading the teen space at our Universal Orlando Foundation Branch — creating places designed for leadership, connection, growth, and fun!



5. WE EXPANDED KEY PARTNERSHIPS

We expanded our impact by strengthening partnerships with organizations like REED Charitable Foundation, Ginsburg Institute, Ginsburg Family Foundation, 4Roots, VyStar Credit Union, Heart of Florida United Way, the Central Florida Mental Health Association, Second Mile Education, Orlando Health, Hilton Grand Vacations, and AdventHealth just to name a few — bringing vital resources and services directly to our Clubs and communities.
